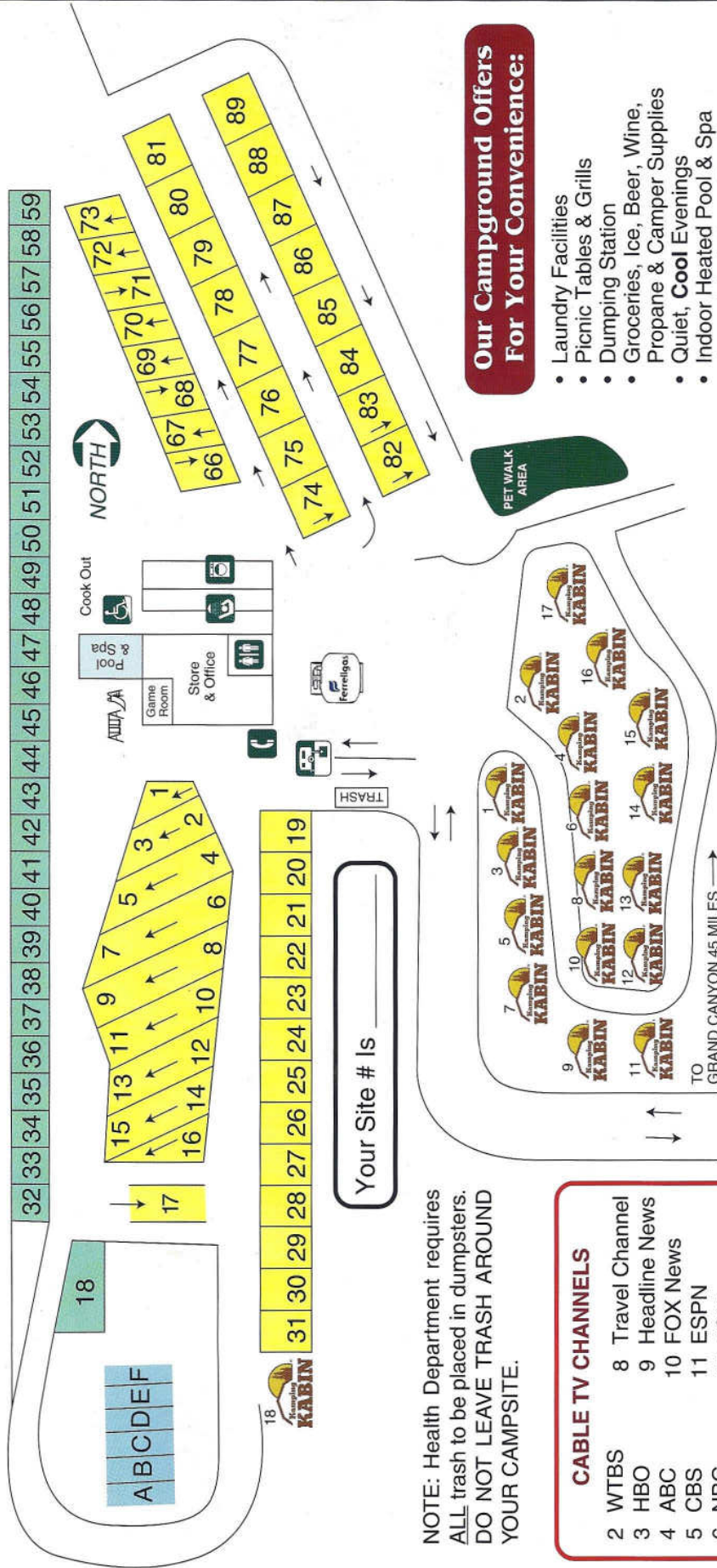

SUGGESTED TOURS AROUND SURROUNDING AREA

Tour 1

The "Grand Canyon of the Colorado River" is deservedly recognized as one of the seven wonders of the world. Ten miles across at its widest point, up to a mile deep, 277 miles long with 2 billion years of geologic history etched into its steep canyon walls.

Imax Theatre - Outstanding film on the Grand Canyon's hidden secrets. Theatre located at the south entrance of the National Park...see the office for details.

Helicopter/Airplane Flights - If you have the time, then experience the ultimate journey, take a flight...see the office for details.

Mather Point - About 1/4 of the entire canyon can be seen from this look-out point.

Yavapai Point and Museum - Museum has "geologic clock" fossil display and excellent views.

National Park Visitors Center - Maps, brochures, talks and slide presentations.

El Tovar and Bright Angel Lodges - Magnificent "old style" hotels.

West Rim Drive - 8 mile one-way drive with breathtaking views at Trail View, Pima Point and Hermits Rest.

Camp Rules

- CHECK OUT** Cabins by 10 AM, RV/Tent sites by 11 AM
- SHOWERS/RESTROOM** Closed everyday at 11 AM till 1 PM for cleaning - NO EXCEPTIONS.
- PETS** Pets are welcome (certain breeds are not allowed please check with office). Pets must be on a leash no longer than 6ft., walked in the designated pet area and cleaned up after.
- NO VEHICLE WASHING** Since all of our water is hauled into the KOA there will be no vehicle washing or unnecessary waste of water... thanks for conserving!
- SWIMMING Absolutely No Diving** - there is no lifeguard on duty and you swim at your own risk. All children under 14 must be accompanied by a parent. No cutoffs or t-shirts allowed... swimsuits only.
- SPA For Adults Only** - No one under 18 allowed.
- TRASH** All trash goes into dumpsters by entrance and dump station - thanks for keeping your site orderly and cigarette - butt free.
- FIRES** Fires are allowed in fire rings & grills only - check with office for any restrictions. Firewood available for purchase in the office.
- QUIET HOURS** 10 PM till 7 AM - Disorderly conduct and/or unnecessary noise will not be tolerated - you will be evicted without a refund if you violate this rule.
- OUTSIDE CLOTHES LINE** No ropes on tree's or otherwise attached to tables, fences, etc.
- NO GENERATORS** No running of generators allowed in campground at any time.
- CHILDREN** Parents are to supervise and assume responsibility for all actions of their children.

Tour 2

Return to Grand Canyon National Park and take the East Rim Drive (Hwy. 64).

Yaki, Grand View, Moran, Lipan and Navajo Points - All offer outstanding but different views of the Grand Canyon.

Tusayan Ruins - Prehistoric Anasazi Indians built this pueblo around AD 1185.

Desert View - Climb the watchtower to view Marble Canyon, Painted Desert and Kaibab Plateau.

Little Colorado River Gorge - Electrifying look into the depths of the Little Colorado River Canyon.

Wupatki - Contains more than 800 separate ruins built during the 11th and 13th centuries.

Sunset Crater - 900 years old and 1000 feet high, the rim having been stained by chemical activity looks something like a perpetual sunset.

Museum of Northern Arizona - Outstanding displays of Native American art and regional history.

Lowell Observatory - Discovery of the planet Pluto in 1930, houses the world's largest collection of planetary photographs.

Meteor Crater - The best, preserved meteorite impact site on planet earth.

Tour 3

Take exit 195A off I-40 at Flagstaff to US 89A - Oak Creek Canyon and Sedona.

Oak Creek Canyon - Features dozens of natural pools and falls as Oak Creek winds its way down 16 miles of sheer rock walls. Slide Rock features a natural waterfall carved by the creek into the canyon's floor...swimming permitted.

Sedona - At the foot of Oak Creek Canyon lies Sedona, famed art center, setting for hundreds of movies and land of the "Red Rock Country".

Tuzigoot - A pueblo of a hundred or so rooms built by the Sinagua Indians during the 13th century.

Montezuma Castle - Not really a castle, it is one of the best preserved Indian Cliff Dwellings in the Southwest.

Fort Verde - Fort Verde served as a major base for General George Crook's cavalry troops during the Apache Wars.

Jerome - Clinging to the slopes of Cleopatra Hill, Jerome was once a roaring mining town of 15,000 people. Once called "The Wickedest Town In The West", Jerome now boasts restored buildings and historic sites - the view is truly magnificent.
